Our Foundation

In 1958, the Gamma Phi Beta Foundation was formed as a trust solely for the promotion and encouragement of educational and charitable purposes. Today, our Foundation continues to financially support you — our members.

The Foundation's mission of sisters helping sisters has truly come to life this year, as we awarded \$195,000 in financial aid to 96 deserving sisters — an 85% increase in aid given over the previous year. We provided an educational and leadership grant to the Sorority, and our members showed up when sisters needed them most, by donating to Loyalty Grants. These actions make a lasting impact on the sisters we serve and as an organization rooted in philanthropy, we must remember that our members are our Why Gamma Phi.

Gamma Phi Beta gave me a place to belong when I was looking for acceptance in college. Yet, when I discovered the world of international Gamma Phi Beta right after I graduated, I saw how the bonds of sisterhood reach far and wide. Today, my why is driven by the deep friendships I have with sisters across the country, from Dallas to Denver, Tampa to LA, they are there — that is why I give back to Gamma Phi Beta in every way I can.

In 2012, the Facilities Management Company (FMC) was formed as an LLC, becoming Gamma Phi Beta's third entity.
