GAMMA PHI BETA ANNOUNCES CLOSURE OF ETA KAPPA CHAPTER (TENNESSEE-CHATTANOOGA)

Centennial, Colorado — It is with great sadness that International Council announces the closure of Eta Kappa Chapter of Gamma Phi Beta at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, effective June 15, 2020.

International President Annabel Jones, spoke about the decision to revoke the Eta Kappa's charter, "Closing a chapter is never an easy decision. Local volunteers and members supported the chapter to the best of their abilities. Eta Kappa was unable to meet goals regarding membership growth and retention. While the members of Eta Kappa will no longer be collegiate members of their chapter, they will always remain True and Constant sisters of Gamma Phi Beta, and we welcome them as alumnae members of our sisterhood."

Eta Kappa Chapter was chartered November 2, 2013, and has 233 living alumnae members. All current collegiate members of Eta Kappa Chapter will be granted alumnae status.
