

GAMMA PHI BETA REGOGNIZES SHIBANI JOSHI WITH CARNATION AWARD

Centennial, CO – Gamma Phi Beta presented Shibani Joshi (Oklahoma) with the Carnation Award at the Sorority's 80th Convention in St. Louis, Missouri. The award recognizes members whose outstanding achievements in fields outside the Sorority have brought them honor or great distinction. Joshi graduated from University of Oklahoma, where she was initiated into the Psi Chapter.

Joshi is an experienced journalist who has covered business, technology and general news for global media outlets including ABC News, Fox News Channel, Yahoo Finance and the Huffington Post. She currently provides commentary on business, technology and lifestyle topics and hosts events for leading corporations.

In her almost six-year tenure, she evolved into the dedicated on-air technology reporter at both Fox News Channel and Fox Business Network. Joshi also reported extensively live on the floor of the New York Stock Exchange, Nasdaq and NYMEX exchanges, covering the 2008 market crash, historic interest rate cuts, record oil prices and the biggest point drop in Dow history (at the time).

Throughout her career, Joshi has been able to obtain exclusive interviews with CEOs and executives from companies including Apple, Qualcomm, Google, Sony and EBay. She has also interviewed execs from Uber, Dropbox, Rent the Runway and Angie's List in their early stages.

A strong advocate of education, Joshi also teaches at the University of Oklahoma, having developed a course entitled Strategic Leadership Communications for the university's Executive MBA program. In addition to her degree from the University of Oklahoma, she holds an MBA from The Harvard Business School. She was a featured speaker at Psi's Centennial in 2018 and was featured as a speaker in our Confident Woman of Character series.

Since 1974, Gamma Phi Beta has presented the Carnation Award to members who excel in their careers and positively represent themselves and the Sorority. The award recognizes impressive personal accomplishments and identifies role models within the organization. This year's additional Carnation Award winners are Heather McDonald (Southern California), Dr. Margaret Myers (Colorado College) and Jeanne Duncan Waggener (Texas-Austin).
