This program will feature eight virtual, interactive modules that will also include small group work, self-assessments and exposure to high-level Gamma Phi Beta leaders and current International Council initiatives. This guided learning experience will include governance model education, board leadership roundtable discussions, study of personality types, conflict styles, case studies modeled after former or current Sorority issues and more.

The Clara Project represents new leadership growth opportunities for our members and prepares interested members for high-level volunteer and board-level service inside and outside of Gamma Phi Beta. This commitment to our members represents our desire to continue to empower, educate and support current and future leaders within Gamma Phi Beta.

Who can participate?

Any member in good standing (current on payment of **annual international alumnae dues** or a **Life Loyal member**) is welcome to apply. Participants can be located outside of the United States. On the first tab, if your paid-through date is blank or if the date is in the past, you have not yet paid this fiscal year. If you are Life Loyal, you have paid for life and are in good standing!

We are seeking individuals who are familiar with nonprofit volunteer and board service and who want to enhance their leadership skills in preparation for future volunteer and board governance roles in Gamma Phi Beta. Leadership skills gained through TCP will also be applicable to a member's professional and volunteer endeavors outside of Gamma Phi Beta.
