

Dr. Ruth Seeler's Legacy Empowers Future Gamma Phi Betas

Centennial, CO – In a testament to the enduring power of generosity, the Gamma Phi Beta community mourns the loss of Dr. Ruth Seeler (Vermont), an extraordinary individual whose legacy will continue to shape the lives of aspiring female physicians within our sisterhood.

Dr. Ruth Seeler, an esteemed board-certified pediatric hematologist-oncologist, made an indelible mark on the medical community throughout her five-decadelong career. As the first woman to graduate from the University of Vermont College of Medicine in 1962, she blazed a trail for countless women in healthcare. Her passion for empowering fellow sisters led to the establishment of The Ruth A. Seeler, M.D. Scholarship and Fellowship Endowment through the Gamma Phi

Beta Foundation, providing vital financial aid to undergraduate and graduate sisters pursuing medical studies. In recognition of her exceptional contributions, Gamma Phi Beta bestowed upon her the prestigious Carnation Award in 1984 and the Philanthropist of the Year Award in 2004.

Upon her passing on October 14, 2022, Ruth's commitment to sisterhood persevered. Her generous bequest included an estimated \$4.2 million (Ruth's estate is still in the process of being settled), the Foundation's largest gift to date. Additionally, she contributed \$250,000 to establish the Ruth Andrea Seeler Leadership Endowment, furthering leadership training and development programs for Gamma Phi Beta members.

As we remember Ruth's spirit of empowerment, her legacy will serve as a guiding light for future generations of Gamma Phi Beta sisters. Her impact on our sisterhood and the medical field stands as a testament to the transformative influence of an individual dedicated to making a difference.
